




Mosquitoes will not hamper the fun as boater's raftup adjacent to Playalinda Beach. For those

From this class, boaters will acquire knowledge beyond the basics and are encouraged to move onto the coastal navigation courses.

Learn how to handle your boat in a variety of situations and become the skipper you want to be. Gain confidence in docking, underway, anchoring, and other seamanship skills.

The fund is no longer growing at a rate great enough to support the scholarship.


As club membership has decreased, our income has declined while expenses are rising. To avoid raising dues, the board has agreed to channel all funds from the recycling project into the operating expenses.
